HISTORIC PRESERVATION MONTH IDEAS – MAY 2020

PURPOSE: As City Council has not allocated additional resources for planning an activity, they must be primarily planned & implemented by HPC members or other volunteers; staff can provide minimal support.

- Release/upload Historic Landmark plaque installation videos and interviews
 - Time-intensive option: video or photograph David Seiler installing the plaques on the Freeman
 & Sutton Houses, and the Zeta Tau Alpha Sorority House
 - Less-time-intensive option: interview and video/photograph the owner of the home when it was nominated, or the nominator themselves, on why it was important that the building be designated
 - o Bridget B. is willing to work on this, as may be Jason Liggett, within staffing constraints
- Downtown Historic District Walking Tour
 - A knowledgeable guide would tour attendees through the district and pass by (all) of the contributing properties, providing verbal info on the properties; walk through as many of the properties as possible.
 - Ask Dan Maloney to give additional info on the importance of the District, and why he initiated the designation process.
 - Have property owners give a brief description of their property, and why it is important to them to have it recognized. If the current property owner is not interested in talking, ask the original nominator.
 - **Create a Downtown District Walking Tour Brochure, to replace or supplement existing Downtown Urbana Walking Tour Brochure?
- Historic Preservation Workshop
 - Window restoration: there are at least two sites that may be actively restoring the windows of their Historic District contributing properties
- Urbana Landmark Hotel Tour
 - Collaborate with new owner/developer to tour of their new property; it could generate good public sentiment for them, while helping remind the general public why the hotel was designated, and its potential for restoration/adaptive reuse.
- Buena Vista Court Tour: tour Court, and have current renovators show us their improvements.
- Greek House, et al. Tour: tour current and adaptively-reused fraternities, sororities, communal living spaces.
