
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

IMMEDIATE CRISIS


Courage Connection provides help to anyone experiencing domestic violence. If you or a loved one needs immediate help, please call their Domestic Violence HOTLINE. 217-384-4390 OR 1-877-384-4390. Courage Connection is located at 1304 East Main Street, Urbana, IL 61802. Go **here** for information.

Courage Connection services include but are not limited to: shelter, legal advocacy, therapy/counseling, and housing assistance.

All services are free and confidential. They include:

- Therapy and Counseling Service

Crisis Nursery creates an "Island of Safety" dedicated to the prevention of child abuse and neglect by providing 24-hour emergency care for children and support to strengthen families in crisis. Crisis Nursery is the only emergency-based childcare facility in Champaign County that is open 24 hours, 365 days a year for the entire community to access with no fees or income eligibility (see next page).


- Safe Children This is for families with children ages 0- 6 years in emergencies that have no resources to help them.
- Strong Families This program provides support and resources to families dealing with challenges such as parental stress, perinatal depression, homelessness, teen parenting, and more.
- **Beyond Blue** this program deals with Post-Partum Depression stress on families.
- Paving Pathways Within the Strong Families program, Paving Pathways strengthens families by supporting interactions between parents and children, contributing to early childhood development and preparing children for success during life's most critical period.

CU at Home engages and mobilizes our community to house and support the most vulnerable homeless on their journey of healing and restoration. CU at Home provides a number of important supportive services to individuals who are experiencing homelessness.

RACES – Rape Advocacy, Counseling, & Education Services – is the community-based rape crisis center serving East-Central Illinois. They provide free, confidential services to anyone who has been affected by sexual assault, abuse, or harassment. Strides Low Barrier Shelter

The City of Champaign Township operates Strides, which provides year-round, full day, low-barrier shelter services to adults. This program will not require sobriety, abstinence, or criminal background check to participate in services. The right to self-determination is not only preserved but encouraged by the program so that the community member determines what they consider success and how they will achieve success. Case managers are assigned to every community member that utilizes the shelter, but ultimately the community member makes the decision on how and when they would like to interact with the case manager. Daytime services are available 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily, and is located at 70 East Washington Street, Champaign. Contact: 217-403-6150.

Compass Counseling



Hope Springs





Carle Clinic







CHILD & YOUTH Advocate groups


