



## **Executive Summary**

- Financial Overview:
  - FY 24 CIP Spending = \$31.3 million (5-year average = \$20.6 million)
  - Total 5-year CIP Spending = \$102.9 million (~23% is dependent on pending grants)
- Mayor-City Council Goals Progress in the CIP
  - Asset Management Planning (3.1A & 3.1B)
  - Equity and Quality of Life (3.2A & 3.2B)
  - Sustainable Facilities (3.3B)
- Facilities Master Plan Implementation Still a need to borrow (\$12 million)
- Staffing Vacancies Limiting CIP Implementation
- Construction Costs Remain high & unpredictable (NHCCI +46% in last 2 years)
- MWDVBE Contracting Success for Engineering Services (~14% by value)
- Grants



## Asset Management Summary






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Since 2021, the City has been transitioning to a public infrastructure asset management approach to integrate planning, finance, engineering, and operations to effectively manage existing and new assets to recognize value/liability, reduce risk, and identify/provide satisfactory levels of service to community users in a fiscally sustainable and sociably equitable manner. This section takes a holistic view of infrastructure assets to keep infrastructure assets functional.

### Asset Management Summary

#### **Asset Valuation**



- Value was estimated based on current reconstruction value
- 2023 CIP Estimated Asset Valuation = \$1,500,000,000 (Yes, that is \$1.5 BILLION, with a B)



Original estimates were developed in the 2021 CIP and have been inflated annually based on National Highway Construction Cost Index which has remained exceptionally high resulting in an aggregate increase of 46% over the past two years. Completion of asset management plans will help further refine these estimates over time.




