DRUG/GUN ARREST - URBANA

On October 30, 2023, at about 12:10 a.m., Urbana police officers observed a vehicle commit a traffic violation, which resulted in a traffic stop at the intersection of University Ave./Orchard St. in Urbana. An open-air sniff around the vehicle was conducted by a drug detection canine team from the University of Illinois. A subsequent search of the vehicle/occupants resulted in the recovery of:

3.87 grams of psilocybin mushrooms
 52.34 grams of cannabis

2.57 grams of prescription amphetamines - Drug packaging materials

- 87.76 grams of cocaine - Stolen Springfield XD Pistol



The driver, 19-year-old Danielle Hoffman from Rantoul, was arrested on various charges including, improper lane usage, operating an uninsured vehicle, and manufacture/delivery of a controlled substance.

Hoffman's passenger, 53-year-old Robert Hunter, also from Rantoul, was found to be in possession of a fully loaded pistol that had been reported stolen from another jurisdiction. Hunter is a convicted felon who was arrested for the manufacture/delivery of a controlled substance, possession of a stolen firearm, unlawful use of a weapon by a felon, and armed violence.
