MINUTES
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION MEETING
Date, April 27, 2021
Held virtually via Zoom

<u>Call to Order</u>: Anne Heinze Silvis called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m.

Roll Call: Breaden Belcher, Community Development Specialist, called the roll. A quorum was present.

Commission Members Present: Anne Heinze Silvis, Chris Diana, and Rev. Robert Freeman

Commission Members Excused/Absent: Patricia Jones, Abdulhakeem Salaam

<u>Others Present</u>: Sheila Dodd, Grants Management Division Manager; Breaden Belcher, Community Development Specialist

<u>Approval of Minutes</u>: Commissioner Freeman moved to approve the minutes of the March 23, 2021 Meeting, and Commissioner Diana seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Petitions and Communications</u>: No petitions or communications were presented

<u>Audience Participation</u>: Chair Person Heinze-Silvis stated that audience members could speak if they so wished or after a particular item is presented, no one from the audience stepped forward to speak

Staff Report: Mr. Belcher reported on the ongoing activities in the Grants Management Division. Staff are preparing for HUD monitoring of the CDBG program, which will take place the week of May 24-28, and HOME program monitoring which will take place June 14-19. City of Urbana staff are currently conducting monitoring of Urbana HOME Consortium members. Mr. Belcher then discussed the FY 21-22 Annual Action Plan, which was approved by City Council on April 26th. The Plan is due to HUD on May 15, but GMD staff will have it completed well before then.

Mr. Belcher stated that the Urbana HOME Consortium will be receiving additional funding through the recently passed American Rescue Plan. The amount has not yet been confirmed, but will be between 1.6 and 3 million dollars. The Urbana HOME Tech Committee has been discussing what to do with these funds in their monthly meetings. Any updates will be communicated to the Commission. Mr. Belcher then discussed progress on Neighborly grants

management software. Staff hope to launch the program soon. This will greatly streamline the grants application and management process for staff and community members.

Old Business: No old business was presented

New Business: Mr. Belcher presented a sub recipient agreement between the City of Urbana and Cunningham Township. The City is entering into a 2 year agreement with the Township to provide a sub grant of \$36,687 in Emergency Solutions Grant funding for their rapid rehousing program. Approximately 5 individuals will be assisted by this funding, which will include case management and tenant-based rental assistance to those experiencing homelessness. No action is required of the Commission. This is merely informative.

Adjournment: Seeing no further business, Ms. Heinze Silvis adjourned the meeting at 6:15 p.m.


