Background

This 2016-2018 cycle, the City of Urbana welcomes five new sculptures that will stay in the community for a period of two years:

- 1. *Monolith* by Timothy Jorgensen was installed at the southwest corner of the Champaign County Courthouse.
- 2. *A New Leaf* by Don Lawler was installed at Parking Lot 1, near the corner of Water Street and Broadway Avenue.
- 3. *The Horse and the Hound* by Jim Collins has been installed at the southwest corner of the Boneyard Creek Crossing.
- 4. *Keep It Together* by Benjamin Pierce has been installed at Leal Park.
- 5. *The Three Red Houses* by Andrew Arvanetes has been installed at Boneyard Creek Crossing, by The Station Theater.

Update

Staff is working to introduce the sculptures to the community by creating a web-based guide. Once completed, the guide will be available on the City website, and will be promoted through the e-newsletter, social media, and online ads. Staff will also create print marketing materials.

The Urbana Park District is currently designing a new website that lists points of interests at Meadowbrook Park, such as sculptures and notable plants. Staff is working with Park District staff to have the website include information on *Byways to Equality*, located at King Park; and *Keep It Together*, located at Leal Park.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Public Arts Commission shares any comments or suggestions they might have on the promotional efforts for the Urbana Sculpture Project.
