Heroes and Dreamers

Post-Project Evaluation

The goal of the "Heroes and Dreamers" project was the production of a short film that depicted a course of study for a diverse group of third and fourth grade students. Using the 1963 March on Washington as a starting point, the students studied noteworthy individuals from the Civil Rights movement; then, identified a particular hero/heroine of their own choosing. Using visual arts, writing, speaking and dance, the students communicated the identities of their heroes and the dreams that they inspired. Grant funds were used to purchase art supplies and to compensate a videographer to document the experience. Without funding from the City of Urbana and the generosity of other individuals the project would not have been possible.

A conservative estimate of instructional time devoted to this project would be about twenty-four hours. This includes time spent reading, discussing, writing, rehearsing and creating art work. Fourteen hours was required for taping and an additional twenty—five for editing and the incorporation of graphics and archival footage. On May 16, 2014, student artwork was displayed and the film premiered at Leal Elementary School.

Forty-one students and five staff members from Leal were directly involved in "Heroes and Dreamers." The presentation itself drew over 400 students as well as approximately 100 family members and community supporters. With plans to air "Heroes and Dreamers" on UPTV as well as having the presentation available on the Urbana School District #116 website, Facebook and Twitter accounts, it could be potentially viewed by hundreds of others. The value of this film as an educational tool should not be discounted. It could be easily incorporated into a course of study on civil rights, Dr. Martin Luther King or other noteworthy individuals who have made valuable contributions throughout history.

In addition to the funds allocated by the City of Urbana, the generosity Russell Stewart, Martin Kamerer, Jeff Mellander and Jennifer Shelby was critical to making this project a reality. Equally important was the dynamic and collaborative relationship of the educational team; Molly Headtke, Maggie Kinnamon, Greg Ballweg and Spencer Landsman. It is my belief that we were all equally invested in creating an educational opportunity of the highest caliber; and, I think we succeeded.
